2022 - THE LOCAL CHALLENGES

What do each of us - as local Friends and user groups - want to achieve during 2022?

Lordship Rec – **Haringey**: Want a complete overhaul of all 7 interpretation boards which were designed by the Friends and installed 10-15 years ago and are now in a declining state. Raising money is a problem for noticeboards. What funding streams might be useful? **Response**: Tesco blue token and waitrose green token are easy for little amounts, funding hub on Parks for London website may be useful: https://parksforlondon.org.uk/opportunities/funding/

Figge's Marsh – Merton: Use of Better Friends tool has shown the need for a strategic Management Plan. Keen to work on one but need examples of a Parks Management Plan. **Response**: Parks Community UK website suggested. https://parkscommunity.org.uk/how-to-guide/a-guide-to-producing-green-space-and-park-management-plans/

Burgess Park – Southwark: With Local elections coming up very keen to get a seat at the hustings to raise issues.

Pinner Village Gardens – Harrow: Looking at Management Plans. Have already introduced bee banks, looking at rewilding approaches. Seeking a no pesticides policy and campaigning against leaf blowers.

Hervey Road – Greenwich: Blackheath Rugby Club in charge of field. Concentrating on care of margins for wildlife. Build planting on perimeter. Will sow wildflower seeds in June. Looking to hold a Field Day (Fields in Trust) in July.

Wandsworth Common - Wandsworth – seeking more engagement with local schools. Looking for a continuation of Parks Police and Local Authority crackdown on badly behaved dogs with Fixed Penalty Notices for dog owners.

Response: Number of ideas for schools involvement discussed including, Duke of Edinburgh engagement, supermarket tokens to raise money. Bulb planting can engage primary schools children; work through school newsletters, engage with school offices/head teachers.

Mayo Park - Lewisham: Challenge to get more volunteers plus diversity of volunteers. Strong borough forum could be a good place to discuss this. Current Forum treading water.

Cherry Tree Wood - Barnet: Promoting a Pollinator trail project linking with other open spaces nearby and creating stepping stones. https://mailchi.mp/b8ade48ba2d8/pollinator-launch-action-notes

Colliers Wood – Merton Aiming to get spaces managed as nature reserves, working on a bee bank. Growing group – had good success via social media, WhatsApp, next door. Sending out links in local councillors' newsletters.

Pinkham Way - Haringey: Campaign to keep green space on this site has been effective for many years now. Biodiversity key element and looking to link greenways locally to other sites.https://www.buglife.org.uk/our-work/b-lines/

Response: From interest shown it was agreed people could join the LFGN biodiversity group. Bug Life's B-lines were mentioned. Issues with GiGL recording system noted with disconnect on information provided and what is available on records. INaturalist and Irecord could also be used.

4. Borough forums - very brief updates

Haringey: The Council, with Parks Forum involvement, are organising a Parks Summit and Trees Summit to discuss issues and collaboration – this arises out of the joint work to develop a new 25yr open spaces strategy. Parks staffing levels are being increased. Council to progress its partnership with Fields in Trust to adopt protective covenants for all 60+ designated public green spaces, but concerns growing over threat of development on non-designated green spaces.

Bromley: Council reorganisation being undertaken. Parks 10 year open space strategy being reviewed.

Lewisham: Mayoral meeting to be held with Forum which needs strengthening.

Merton: High turnover in Parks Team with new people coming in and time needed for them to bed in.

Barnet: Forum meeting next evening to discuss their Election Manifesto and borough wide issues.

Wandsworth: Forum working well and met quarterly. Looking to hold post LFGN meetings as feedback from LFGN meeting can be given. ENABLE management increasing staffing levels.

Camden: Friends of Parks meetings convened by the Council. Maintenance schedule for the year has been issued.

Brent: Forum is supporting pocket parks. Currently good liaison with Parks Service. Have secured £10k for a biodiversity project which is to be shared across the borough.

Redbridge: Unclear if a Forum still currently active. Vision Redbridge runs parks open spaces and cultural services – a social enterprise.

5. LFGN brief updates - eg working groups (biodiversity/planning/events), social media etc

Planning: Local Green Space designation being promoted by CPRE and to be looked at and lobbied for across London. General support given to groups fighting development of parks.

Biodiversity: As discussed earlier. Group looking to expand and meet (probably March 7th) before next LFGN general meeting to discuss potential programme of work.

Events: New working group concerned mainly with large inappropriate commercial events.. they are beavering away in the background. Simon (Hyde Park) noted that slot-booking for public access to Winter Wonderland in Hyde Park worked well this year and spread the load.

LFGN Social Media: No key issues at moment.

LFGN Support: Laura's important post supporting GoParks and LFGN is currently based at CPRE (London). It is looking for additional funding and a new 'home'. London National Park City may be an option.

6. London and national greenspace organisations v. brief updates (eg GoParksLondon, Parks for London, A More Natural Capital coalition, London Gardens Trust, NFPGS, CPRE, Wildlife Link etc)

GoParksLondon: promoting green spaces and Friends Groups. Promoted Ealing recently. Looking to register every Friends group onto the Go Parks map. Can all groups check the Map or contact laura@cprelondon.org.uk

Parks for London. Current survey of 16-25 young Londoners views on parks and open spaces going up to 28th February. Green Infrastructure guidance being reviewed later in year by GLA. Working with Mayor on Green Skills hub to address workforce skills shortages across London – Looking at potential routes into work including volunteering. https://www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/CTDL7NK

LFGN and PfL have drafted a joint Local Elections appeal to make parks an issue in the London local Council elections in May – to be circulated in March.

A More Natural Capital: A coalition of around 20 environmental NGOs across London produced a manifesto for the last London Mayoral election and are continuing to meet. They have reviewed progress of current Mayor on green issues, and are planning a call for Local Council candidates in May to back effective environmental policies and action (including support for parks).

Wildlife Link: Coordinating a major campaign by 60 national greenspace and health organisations (including the NFPGS) calling for #natureforeveryone, with a legal right of access to quality greenspace, backed by a £5.5 billion levelling up fund from the Government. To be launched 21st Feb. Note: a recent poll found that 80% of the public backed a legal right to local nature.
